Featured throughout the US in flute club concerts and festivals (including the New York Flute Club and the National Flute Association Convention), Vinci has also performed at colleges internationally and in return engagements at her alma maters.

"Percussia: Chamber Music for a New World, " Vinci recorded music for flute and percussion by Shankar, Harrison, Piazzolla, Crumb and Takemitsu. Vinci's up-coming CD on Albany Records, "American FluteScape: A Tapestry of Premieres and Classics," includes works that she commissioned of Pulitzer Prize winner Jennifer Higdon's "Flute Poetic for flute and piano" and Mark Vinci's "Crow's Nest for solo flute" and "TINGsha Bom-t-Bom-t-Bom for flute and orchestra." In this project Vinci collaborates with acclaimed pianist Reiko Uchida and the New York Dream Orchestra. Multi-Grammy winner Adam Abeshouse has been the recording engineer and producer for three of Vinci's Albany Records CD's.

Vinci's recent commission/performance/recording projects include Pulitzer Prize winner Long Zhou's "Confluence for solo flute" (as part of the Flute New Music Consortium), Carleton Macy's "Autumn Sky: Fantasy for flute and concert band," and Tom Stoneman's "A Day in the Life for flute, hip-hop artist and electronics."

Jan Vinci earned a D.M.A. in Flute Performance from The Juilliard School, a M.M. from The Cleveland Institute of Music, and a B.M. from Bowling Green State University. She studied with Julius Baker, Samuel Baron, Maurice Sharp, Judith Bentley and Martha Aarons. Currently, Vinci is Senior Artist-in-Residence at Skidmore College in Saratoga Springs, NY. She formerly served on the faculties of Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College and Hofstra University. Dr. Vinci has a rich history of teaching master classes at many colleges and for flute clubs throughout the USA and abroad, as well as during her Skidmore Flute Institute from 1992-2012.
